Conditions of entry

- Entries must be unpublished, original and unaided work.
- Poems (maximum of 50 lines) and prose or descriptive piece (maximum 2000 words) should reflect the life, the land or the people, of the past or present, in the Cottesloe, Peppermint Grove or Mosman Park locale.
- A combination of words and images that illustrate the subject is encouraged but not essential.
- Entries must be submitted on A4 white 80gsm paper, typed or handwritten on one side only.
- Entries must not include your name. Your name should only appear on the entry form.
- A maximum of one prose entry and one poetry entry per person may be submitted.
- The organising councils take no responsibility for any late, lost or misdirected mail entries.
- Awards will be conferred if, in the opinion of the judges, entries justify an award. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- The Shire of Peppermint Grove, as managers of the library service, reserves the right to retain entries in the local history collection. The participating councils also retain the right to reproduce the work for promotional purposes, with acknowledgement to the author.
- Entries including the signed entry form must reach the Cottesloe Peppermint Grove Mosman Park Library by **5.00pm Friday 28 May 2010**.
